Representative Cases & Matters

Assisted in obtaining a summary judgment in a wrongful death/survival action arising from a fatal shooting, resulting in dismissal of all claims against their clients, the alleged shooter and his employer. The case stemmed from a remodeling dispute in which the decedent confronted one of the defendants, threatened him, and pointed a gun at him, after which the defendant shot the decedent in self-defense. The court granted summary judgment based on a *Lamp v. Heyman* argument, finding the plaintiff failed to timely and diligently serve the defendants before the statute of limitations expired. The court also granted summary judgment to Wesley and Sylvia Deaderick on corporate veil grounds and to Deaderick Enterprises, Inc., holding there was no basis for vicarious or direct liability because the shooting was outside the scope of employment and no negligent training or supervision was established.
