She worked at a Brooklyn-based law firm in New York where she represented clients in family law, foreclosure defense, probate and estate administration, and landlord-tenant disputes, handling everything from motion practice to appellate briefs and settlement negotiations. In 2018, she began handling mass tort matters at a long-standing plaintiffs' class action/mass torts law firm. As Senior Associate, she represented clients injured by defective Hernia Mesh implants in multi-district litigations and state courts.

Veronica earned her J.D. from Boston University School of Law, where she was active in the Black Law Students Association and the Fellowship for Christian Lawyers. She graduated *magna cum laude* from the State University of New York at Albany with a B.A. in Criminal Justice, earning honors including Phi Beta Kappa and the Frederick Douglass Scholar designation.
